According to *The Lost Colony's* Producer, Carl Curnutte, "When our costume shop burned, we not only lost the costumes the public sees, but those they don't often see that are in our wardrobe stock—as well as props in the production. The costumes in this stock are used for understudies, extras, replacements and various public appearances." Locals from the community have been
